

Winter waves

This is a soft and cuddly baby blanket that works up very fast since you use an 8 mm hook. When you use 3 different colors, you don't have to cut the yarn after each row. You let it run along the edges. The last thing you do on the blanket is adding a border on the long sides. When you do that, you work away the yarn that has been running along.



You change color after each row with the exception if row 2 (you work the initial ch74, row 1 and row 2 in the same color) The color change is worked in the last pull trough of the last stitch on the row. The color repetition is 1, 2, 3, 1, 2, 3, and so on.

It's easy to adjust the size of the blanket. It's worked in multiples of 6+2.

Measurements

73 cm x 80 cm

Material

2 x Pingouin Dream Acier (color 1)
2 x Pingouin Dream Orage (color 2)
2 x Pingouin Dream Flanelle (color 3)
8 mm hook
darning needle

Abbreviations

ch – chain

st/sts – stitch/stitches

yo - yarn over

dc -double crochet

sc - single crochet

sk - skip

hdc - half double crochet

RS - right side

standing sc - make a slip knot and place it on the hook, insert the hook in the indicated st, yo, pull up a loop, yo, pull through both loops on the hook

Instructions

Start with color 1. Ch74

1. Sc in the second ch from the hook and in all of the ch to the end of the row, turn.

2. Ch3 (counts as a dc), 2 dc in the last sc of the previous row (see picture), sk 2 sts, sc, * 5 dc in next st, sk 2 sts, sc in next st, sk 2 sts *, repeat from * until 1 st remain, 3 dc in the last st, change to the next color in the last pull through of the last st, turn.



3. Ch1 (does not count as st), sc in the last dc of the previous row (see picture), * sk 2 sts, 5 dc in next st, sk 2 sts, sc in the third dc of the shell *, repeat from * to * to the end of the row, change to the next color in the last pull trough of the last st, turn.



4 - 48. Repeat row 2 and 3 (the last row is worked in color 3).

49. Ch3 (counts as a dc), hdc, sc in next 3 sts, hdc, * dc, hdc, sc in next 3 sts, hdc *, repeat from * to * until there is 1 st left, dc in the last st, turn.

50. Ch1 (does not count as a st), sc in all sts to the end of the row.

Long side edge

Have the RS facing you. Standing sc in the last sc on the short side, * 2 sc around the dc, sc in sc *, repeat from * to * to the end of the row. Cut the yarn and repeat on the other long side.



Cut the yarn and work away the ends.
Your blanket is now done!
