



Lavender Kite

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Lavender Kite is an asymmetric shawl that is worked in five different segments. The pattern is suitable for everyone from beginners to advanced crocheters. Choose a Whirl and a Whirlette that have the same color on the inside **or** the outside of the Whirl yarn cake. Start working with the yarn of the Whirl yarn cake that is **not** the same color as your Whirlette. If you start from the inside of your Whirl, it might be a good idea to rewind the yarn cake to avoid tangling. Continue with the Whirlette when you run out of Whirl. It doesn't matter where you are in the pattern when this happens. The burgundy/purple shawl is made in Whirl 789 and Whirlette 855. The green shawl is made in Whirl 775 och Whirlette 856.

Material

Scheepjes Whirl x 1 yarn cake

Scheepjes Whirlette x 1 yarn cake

4 mm hook

1 stitch marker

Abbreviations

sc - single crochet

ss - slip stitch

dc - double crochet

yo - yarn over

st/sts - stitch/stitches

ch3 - chain 3

sc2tog - single crochet 2 together: insert hook in next st, yo, pull up a loop, insert hook in next st, yo, pull up a loop, yo, pull through all 3 loops on the hook

sc3tog - single crochet 3 together: insert hook in next st, yo, pull up a loop, insert hook in next st, pull up a loop, insert hook in next st, pull up a loop, yo, pull through all 4 loops on the hook

dc2tog - double crochet 2 together: yo, insert hook in next st, yo, pull up a loop, yo, pull through 2 loops on the hook, yo, insert hook in next st, yo, pull up a loop, yo, pull through 2 loops on the hook, yo, pull through all 3 loops on the hook

decrease with 3 dc - decrease with 3 double crochet: dc, skip 1 st, dc, skip 1 st, dc

Measurements

top edge 170 cm

from top edge to point 65 cm

Pattern

Start

1. Ch3, 2 sc in the second ch from the hook, 2 sc in the third ch from the hook, turn.
2. Ch1 (does not count as st from here and throughout), 2 sc in the first st, sc2tog, 2 sc in the last st, turn.
3. Ch1, 2 sc in the first st, sc in all sts until there is 1 st left, 2 sc in the last st, turn.
4. Ch1, 2 sc in the first st, sc, sc3tog, **(place a stitch marker in the sc3tog)**, sc, 2 sc in the last st, turn.
5. Ch1, 2 sc in the first st, 2 sc, 1 sc **(work this st in the marked st from the previous row, place the stitch marker in this st)**, 2 sc, 2 sc in the last st, turn.
6. Ch1, 2 sc in the first st, sc in all sts until there is 1 st left before the marked st, sc3tog, **(place the stitch marker in the sc3tog)**, sc in all sts until there is 1 st left, 2 sc in the last st, turn.
7. Ch1, 2 sc in the first st, sc in all sts until you reach the marked st, sc **(work this st in the marked st from the previous row, place the stitch marker in this st)** sc in all sts until there is 1 st left, 2 sc in the last st, turn.
- 8 - 21. Repeat row 6 and 7 seven more times.

22. Ch3 (counts as a dc), dc in the same st, * ch1, skip 1 st, dc *, repeat from * to * 3 more times, ch1, decrease with 3 dc (**place the stitch marker in the second dc of the decrease**), repeat from * to * 4 times, ch1, skip 1 st, 2 dc in the last st, turn.

23. Ch1, 2 sc in the first st, * sc in the next st, sc in the ch *, repeat from * to * 4 more times, sc in next 3 sts (**place the stitch marker in the second sc of the 3 sc**), sc in the ch, repeat from * to * 4 times, sc in the next st, 2 sc in the third ch in the ch3, turn.

Form here on we're going to work a sequence of 12 rows twelve times.

24. Ch1, 2 sc in the first st, sc in all sts until there is 1 st left before the marked st, sc3tog, (**place the stitch marker in the sc3tog**), sc in all sts until there is 1 st left, 2 sc in the last st, turn.

25. Ch1, 2 sc in the first st, sc in all sts until you reach the marked st, sc (**work this st in the marked st from the previous row, place the stitch marker in this st**) sc in all sts until there is 1 st left, 2 sc in the last st, turn.

26 - 33. Repeat row 24 and 25 four more times.

34. Ch3 (counts as a dc), dc in the same st, * ch1, skip 1 st, dc *, repeat from * to * until there are 3 sts left before the marked st, ch1, decrease with 3 dc (**place the stitch marker in the second dc of the decrease**), repeat from * to * until there are 2 sts left, ch1, skip 1 st, 2 dc in the last st, turn.

35. Ch1, 2 sc in the first st, * sc in the next st, sc in the ch *, repeat from * to * until there is 1 st left before the marked st, sc in next 3 sts (**place the stitch marker in the second sc of the 3 sc**), sc in the ch, repeat from * to * until there are 2 sts left, sc in the next st, 2 sc in the third ch in the ch3, turn.

36 - 167. Repeat row 24 - 35 eleven more times.

It's now time to change the shape of the shawl and create the point. We do this by going from increasing on both sides of the shawl to continue increasing on one side and decreasing on the other.

168. Ch1, 2 sc in the first st, sc in all sts until there is 1 st left before the marked st, sc3tog, (**place the stitch marker in the sc3tog**), sc in all sts until there is 1 st left, 2 sc in the last st, turn.

169. Ch1, 2 sc in the first st, sc in all sts until you reach the marked st, sc (**work this st in the marked st from the previous row, place the stitch marker in this st**) sc in all sts until there is 1 st left, 2 sc in the last st, turn.

170 - 171. Repeat row 168 and 169 one more time.

172. Ch1, 2 sc in the first st, sc in all sts until there is 1 st left before the marked st, sc3tog, (**place the stitch marker in the sc3tog**), sc in all sts until there are 2 sts left, sc2tog, turn.

173. Ch1, sc in all sts until you reach the marked st, sc (**work this st in the marked st from the previous row, place the stitch marker in this st**) sc in all sts until there is 1 st left, 2 sc in the last st, turn.

174 - 177. Repeat row 172 and 173 two more times.

178. Ch3 (counts as a dc), dc in the same st, * ch1, skip 1 st, dc *, repeat from * to * until there are 3 sts left before the marked st, ch1, decrease with 3 dc (**place the stitch marker in the second dc of the decrease**), repeat from * to * until there are 3 sts left, ch1, dc2tog, turn.

179. Ch1, * sc in the next st, sc in the ch *, repeat from * to * until there is 1 st left before the marked st, sc in next 3 sts (**place the stitch marker in the second sc of the 3 sc**), sc in the ch, repeat from * to * until there are 2 sts left, sc in the next st, 2 sc in the third ch in the ch3, turn.

Form here on we're going to work a sequence of 12 rows five times.

180. Ch1, 2 sc in the first st, sc in all sts until there is 1 st left before the marked st, sc3tog, (**place the stitch marker in the sc3tog**), sc in all sts until there is 2 sts left, sc2tog, turn.

181. Ch1, sc in all sts until you reach the marked st, sc (**work this st in the marked st from the previous row, place the stitch marker in this st**) sc in all sts until there is 1 st left, 2 sc in the last st, turn.

182 - 189. Repeat row 180 and 181 four more times.

190. Ch3 (counts as a dc), dc in the same st, * ch1, skip 1 st, dc *, repeat from * to * until there are 3 sts left before the marked st, ch1, decrease with 3 dc (**place the stitch marker in the second dc of the decrease**), repeat from * to * until there are 3 sts left, ch1, dc2tog, turn.

191. Ch1, * sc in the next st, sc in the ch *, repeat from * to * until there is 1 st left before the marked st, sc in next 3 sts (**place the stitch marker in the second sc of the 3 sc**), sc in the ch, repeat from * to * until there are 2 sts left, sc in the next st, 2 sc in the third ch in the ch3, turn.

192 - 239. Repeat row 180 - 191 four more times.

Finishing

240. Ch1, 2 sc in the first st, sc in all sts until there is 1 st left before the marked st, sc3tog, (**place the stitch marker in the sc3tog**), sc in all sts until there are 2 sts left, sc2tog, turn.

241. Ch1, sc in all sts until you reach the marked st, sc (**work this st in the marked st from the previous row, place the stitch marker in this st**) sc in all sts until there is 1 st left, 2 sc in the last st, turn.

242 - 257. Repeat row 240 and 241 eight more times.

258. Ch1, 2 sc in the first st, sc in all sts until there is 1 st left before the marked st, sc3tog, sc until there are 4 sts left, sc3tog, ss in the last st.

Cut the yarn and work away the ends. Block the shawl to the measurements.
